EARLY YEARS & ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

he 2023-2024 school year in the TCIS Early Childhood Education (ECE) and Elementary School (ES) divisions continued our students down the pathway to fulfilling the TCIS school wide vision of "providing a variety of academic pathways to communicate, collaborate, think critically, and become responsible leaders who positively participate and compassionately contribute to the world." In this Elementary School section of the TCIS Annual Report, we will highlight some of the key accomplishments for this school year and the new initiatives and resources we have begun to implement.

New Mac Mini Lab

Elementary school students have been enjoying the new Mac mini computer lab that was introduced at the start of the school year. Students are using this advanced technology to collaborate with peers, develop their basic and more advanced technology skills, design projects, problem solve, and play engaging educational games. This Mac mini lab, in addition to our iPad initiative from last year, is helping the elementary students at TCIS develop their 21st Century skills and better understand how technology can be a powerful tool for learning.









Trilingual Literacy Development

The mission of TCIS "is to provide a rigorous educational program that develops strong communicators through languages: Chinese, Thai, and English anchored by American curriculum standards." In an effort to continue to fulfill this mission, we now have a Taiwanese native Mandarin speaker as a homeroom teacher in one of our classes from PK3 through to Kindergarten. This allows for the students in our ECE division to have significant exposure to the Mandarin language throughout the school day. We believe this will help to develop a strong foundation in our early years Chinese program, leading to further success in our students' elementary studies and beyond.



STEM: Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics

This school year we have refocused our effort on providing the students in the TCIS ES division with the best possible foundation for their success in science and math, along with designing projects that incorporate technology and engineering practices. An example is our new math program called FishTank Math, which is being used from kindergarten through to the fourth grade. This program better helps support students who are struggling with foundational math concepts, while at the same time challenging those students who are ready for more advanced work. We have also further developed the units in our Mystery Science program. Mystery Science is based on the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) from the U.S.A. This highly engaging program has students immersed in science and engineering practices, using hands-on activities that replicate the work that real life STEM professionals do. In combination, FishTank Math, Mystery Science, and the planning and lesson delivery of our dedicated teachers are preparing our younger students with the foundational STEM knowledge and skills they need for the challenges of future higher level math and science courses that are offered at TCIS.















Student Learner Outcomes (SLOs)

The TCIS Student Learner Outcomes or SLOs are a key set of goals that help connect all our students from PK2 to our seniors. For our youngest students, our five SLO goals are placed in friendlier "I can" or "I am" statements for better understanding. These statements are as follows:

- I can ask questions (Complex Thinker and Problem Solvers)
- I can use my words; I can listen with my whole body (Effective Communicator)
- I can try to learn new things even if they are scary (Independent Life Long Learner)
- I can work nicely with others (Collaborative Worker)
- I am learning about the world and how to take care of it (Responsible Global Participant)

We emphasize a SLO each month both in and outside the classroom and reward the students that exemplify the SLO with an award at our monthly assembly. This helps the SLOs remain at the forefront of everything we do here at TCIS, keeping them authentic and relevant for our students.



Early Childhood Exploratory Play

Over the past two years, a considerable percentage of the ECE/ES divisional budget has been going towards the promotion of more developmentally appropriate exploratory learning and play materials in the classroom. These new resources, including sand play, puppets, kitchen replica toys, stacking cups, pattern play, blocks, plush toys, and dress-up materials, have been a big hit with our students. They use these new materials to share their ideas, express their moods, develop their creativity, and design new things. It is amazing to see these young students during their center time both having fun and learning at the same time.



Sports Day

The Physical Education Department, under the leadership of Mr. Sean, planned another fun-filled day of games and athletic competition for our annual Sports Day activity. Our youngest students enjoyed non-competitive fun games that challenged their gross motor skills. Our elementary students were designated to teams and competed with each other in traditional sports and non-traditional games. This was a great day to promote physical activity, teamwork, and the spirit of competition. Everybody enjoyed the end of the day cola popsicle treat as well!











Student Council

Under the teacher leadership of Ms. Brianna and Ms. Cheryl, the Elementary Student Council has continued to impress us with their leadership and creative activities for our students. This year's key highlight was a highly successful Halloween event, which had students dressing up in their favorite costume, trick-or-treating for lots of candy, and then enjoying the parent sponsored bouncy castles, ball pit, maze, and slides. Another key Student Council initiative was the starting of a Buddy Bench, which provided a space for students to go if they are in need of a friend to talk to or play with. he 2023-2024 academic year was a time of many firsts. We had our first school-wide Week Without Walls, relaunched a new advisory program, expanded our sports program, and much more. Our outstanding teachers and their collaboration with our families made this possible. Their trust and feedback created a thriving school community.

The athletic program also grew substantially thanks to our Athletic Director, Mr. Sean Allen. Students were continuously participating in sports competitions. Our players attended tournaments hosted at other international schools, but we also hosted many games and tournaments this year. Joining the TCIS team meant they were representatives of our school. As such, students had to qualify academically and athletically. It was great to see our students earn medals, but more importantly, it was great to see our students and families take pride in our school.



In addition to sports, our students competed against the top international students from around the world in academic competitions. A crucial aspect of our social-emotional learning initiative is the reinstatement of advisory sessions, where small groups of students convene with a dedicated teacher daily for 40 minutes. These sessions encompass academic support, reading activities, and announcements, alongside a designated day termed Wolf Day for collaborative exercises, team building, events, and assemblies, ensuring enrichment of learning experiences beyond traditional classroom settings without compromising instructional time. Our school celebrated the inaugural Week Without Walls program, a collaborative effort involving extensive student engagement and planning. Grade 5 and 6 students engaged in challenging activities and team-building excursions locally, while Grade 7 and 8 embarked on an amazing journey to Chiang Mai, fostering community, cultural appreciation, and collaboration. Feedback from students and parents will inform future iterations of the program, with plans to expand its scope across Grades 5 to 12. Middle school represents a formative period, marked by enduring memories of shared experiences, triumphs, and joys. As we approach summer, let us continue to create cherished memories and set ambitious goals, building upon the achievements of this year with excitement for the journey ahead.

Week Without Walls

This year, TCIS high school students had the opportunity to participate in our first Week Without Walls experiential learning program. The trip focused on community service, adventure, and culture. Our high school students traveled to Vietnam, where they visited Danang, Hue, and the UNESCO heritage city of Hoi An, where they engaged in various new experiences.

Planning for the Future

The high school counselors and academic team met with parents of grades 8 and 11 to discuss college planning. Students presented their university and career plans during these meetings. Grade 8 focuses on transitioning to high school and setting up a four-year plan. Grade 11 prepares for senior year and the university application process. TCIS counselors help identify suitable university programs. University fairs throughout the year showcased institutions globally, offering students insights into programs and cultures, inspiring international academic pursuits.









National Honor Society

The National Honor Society (NHS) recognizes outstanding high school students globally for their achievements in Scholarship, Character, Service, and Leadership. It promotes excellence and community betterment. TCIS welcomed eleven new NHS members in the 2023-2024 school year. These students have shown exceptional dedication and service both within and outside TCIS. Throughout the year, NHS has organized various initiatives, including fundraising booths, sales to benefit charitable causes, and participation in community events. Their commitment to the four pillars remains steadfast as they continue their work in the future.



Academic Competitions

Academic competitions like Model United Nations (MUN) offer valuable real-world learning experiences, enhancing students' global understanding and skills in research, critical thinking, and public speaking. Participation fosters teamwork, diplomacy, and negotiation, mirroring international relations scenarios. TCIS students excelled at the RIS MUN Conference, with one earning an honorable mention. Beyond MUN, TCIS students shine in science, language, and arts competitions, showcasing their diverse talents and academic strengths. Our robotics team also performed exceptionally well in international competitions, demonstrating innovation, teamwork, and coding skills. They've even shared their creations with elementary students to foster interest in robotics.



University Acceptances and Scholarships

Congratulations to our senior class, who have had incredible success getting accepted into universities in the U.S. and worldwide, along with a bounty of scholarships. 100% of our graduates have received university acceptance, and over 80% of the graduates received offers from universities in the U.S.A, Canada, and Australia. These include U.C. Davis, Goucher College, the University of Toronto,



the University of British Columbia, and the University of Melbourne. Some TCIS students have been accepted to prestigious art and design schools such as the Art Institute of Chicago and Savannah College of Art and Design (SCAD).

In addition, many of our seniors have been accepted to the top universities in Taiwan, including National Taiwan University (NTU) and National Tsing Hua University. Our students also gained acceptance from top schools in Thailand, including Chulalongkorn, Thammasat, and Mahidol. Many of our students are focusing their studies on the areas of medicine, engineering, business, and the arts. Our seniors have over 250 acceptances from over 100 universities in over 10 countries. They have also been offered over \$16.5 million USD in scholarships and an average of over \$500,000 in scholarships per student.

Advanced Placement (AP) Program

TCIS offers a variety of AP courses and the Capstone Program from the American College Board. These university-level courses include exams to earn advanced



standing or university credit in the USA, Canada, and many other countries. Our students applying to top US, Canadian, United Kingdom, or Taiwan schools often have a competitive advantage in university admissions because of the AP components TCIS offers.

1 Taiwan Universities Acceptance

We are very proud that this year the school's admission list in Taiwan is extremely impressive. 6 people were admitted to National Taiwan University, 3 of whom won scholarships; 7 people were admitted to National Tsinghua University, of which 3 were awarded scholarships; 1 was admitted to National Chengchi University; and 2 people were admitted to National Cheng Kung University.

2 Taiwan Universities Trip

In June this year, the Chinese Department arranged for nearly 30 parents and students to visit the Ministry of Education of the Republic of China, the Overseas Chinese Affairs Council, National Taiwan University, National Tsinghua University, National Taiwan Normal University, National Taiwan University of Science and Technology, and National Chengchi University. TCIS also signed a letter of intent to cooperate with, and become a strategic partner of, National Taiwan University. TCIS can recommend 2 students each year to receive scholarships provided by National Taiwan University. This scholarship includes free tuition and fees and a monthly living allowance of NT\$8,000.

Since TCIS high school alumni have performed very well in universities in Taiwan, 43 universities in Taiwan came to the school to hold the Taiwan Higher Education Exhibition on August 24, 2023. Hundreds of students from grades 8 to 12 participated in the event. This not only makes Taiwan universities more aware of TCIS, but also increases the interest of more TCIS students to study in universities in Taiwan.




Music and the National Symphony Orchestra




